Named after the remarkable Effie Yeaw, an elementary teacher and passionate advocate for environmental conservation, our Nature Center embodies her bold spirit of curiosity, learning, and love for the natural world.

Since our founding almost fifty years ago by Sacramento County Regional Parks, this diverse biological ecosystem and culturally significant region has been a notable landmark in the Sacramento area for nature enthusiasts, trekkers, and citizen scientists.

Nestled within the tranquil beauty of Ancil Hoffman Park and operated by the American River Natural History Association since 2010, the Effie Yeaw Nature Center is an unique experience for those seeking to **DISCOVER**, **EXPLORE**, and **ENGAGE** in the lower American River Parkway.

DISCOVER

HOURS OF OPERATION Monday: Closed, Tuesday-Sunday 9:00am-5:00pm (winter hours may differ)

PARKING ARNHA Members are free. Daily parking pass: \$7.00; Sacramento County Regional Parks Annual Pass: \$70.00. Parking passes may be purchased at the front gate of Ancil Hoffman Park or inside the Nature Center. Exact cash appreciated; no bills over \$50.00

AMMENITIES Indoor and outdoor restrooms; Natural History Museum exhibits; children's playscape; outdoor exhibits including cultural classroom and Valley Nisenan Summer Village replica, observation pond, and pollinator garden; Assembly Building; 100-acre Nature Study Area with hiking trails and American River access; picnic area and water fountains; live animal ambassadors; Discovery Store giftshop.

EXPLORE

LEAVE NO TRACE Stay on trail; pack it in, pack it out; no collecting (rocks, feathers, plants, etc...); take only photos and leave only footprints; help us keep plants native by cleaning your shoes on the way back at the boot-scrubber by the trailhead.

ONLY SERVICE ANIMALS ALLOWED Pets are not allowed inside the Nature Study Area as they negatively impact the sensitive ecosystem and encounters between them, and wildlife can be dangerous.

HORSES AND BIKES Horses and bicycles are not allowed inside the Nature Study Area. Horses may be ridden in other areas of Ancil Hoffman Park. Bicycles are permitted on paved surfaces only.

RATTLESNAKES Visitors are encouraged to wear closed-toe shoes and to stay on the trails as the Nature Study Area is home to rattlesnakes.

FIRE-FREE ZONE The Nature Study Area is a fire-free zone. Campfires, smoking, fireworks, and BBQs are not allowed. There is a park BBQ located across the road from the Nature Center in an approved BBQ pit.

FLOTATION DEVICES Always use U.S. Coast Guard approved flotation devices for children under 12 years of age when floating, swimming, boating, or paddling in rivers or ponds—it's the law! (Available at the Golf Course for free use.)

STAY HYDRATED Feel free to fill up your water bottles at our water fountains.

DRESS ACCORDINGLY The Nature Study Area's landscape changes with the seasons. Wear proper attire and bring the necessary gear for the weather.

HOME SWEET HOME The Nature Study Area is home to a coterie of wildlife! Be mindful of your presence because that pile of leaves/cluster of twigs/hole in the ground may actually be an animal's nest/den/burrow. Suggested size on the trails is 20 or less per group.

NEVER PICK UP A BABY ANIMAL! Its parents are most likely nearby. If it is obviously injured, please report concerns to the Nature Center at (916) 876-4918 so that we can contact Fish and Wildlife if deemed necessary.
